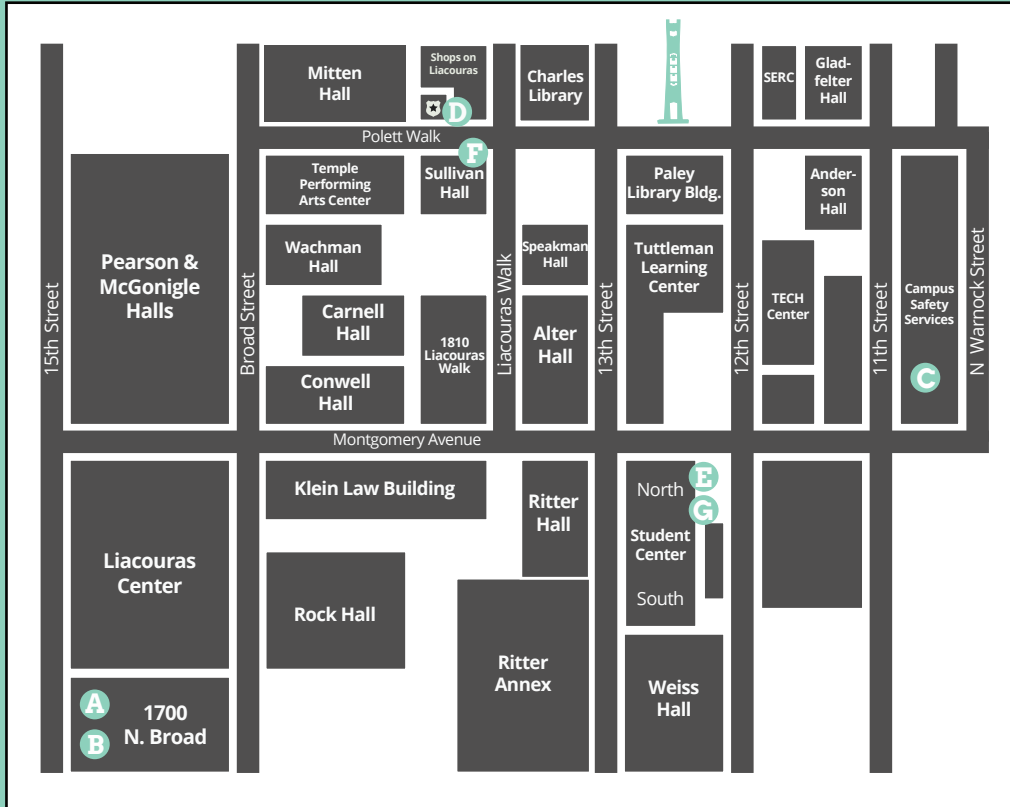

What does it mean to be a confidential resource?

If someone wants to share their experience of abuse, assault, or harassment, these offices **will not report** that experience to the Title IX Coordinator.

What does it mean to be a non-confidential resource?

Certain university employees are required to report incidents of sexual misconduct to the Title IX Coordinator. This process can be done in collaboration with students and is intended to help create a safer campus community.



WOAR is Philadelphia’s Center Against Sexual Violence

They operate a 24-hour hotline and offer support groups, advocacy, and counseling for individuals who have experienced sexual assault and harassment. They can meet students in crisis at a private location on campus.
